

BY-LAW NO. 8

Effective February 8, 1962

Adopted May 10, 1961

Ministerial Approval: February 8, 1962

“Domestic animals and fowl” essentially means any animal or bird that isn’t wild, such as farm animals. It includes horses, cattle, sheep, pigs, turkeys, chickens, geese, and ducks. This By-Law doesn’t include dogs or cats.

This By-Law doesn’t allow owners of domestic animals and fowls to:

-) Leave their premises unless in the owner’s custody; or
-) Cause any damage to anyone or their property.

Violators of this By-Law can be fined \$20, and if they don’t pay the fine, can be imprisoned for ten days.

This summary is meant to simplify the related By-Law and in NO WAY replaces the actual By-Law. In the event that the By-Law is contravened, all terms listed in the By-Law will take precedence over this Summary.
